[JKTK1]“laenihi” was typed here, but “laenihi” is only Hemipteronotus or Iniistius genera.

Page: 3

[JKTK2]Corrected from Cheilinus uniusciatus

Page: 3

[JKTK3]“po’ou” was typed here, but it refers to Cheilinus rhodochrous

Page: 3

[JKTK4]Or should this be Alutera monoceros, which is the loulou. If it is not monoceros, delete “loulou.”

Page: 3

[JKTK5]changed from “scribbled”

Page: 3

[JKTK6]careful! corrected this from “‘u’u ” which means “masturbate, strip, hoist, or answer back rudely”!

Page: 3

[JKTK7]Found no “carolinus” to verify, so changed to “sanwicensis,” which was verified.

Page: 3

[JKTK8]Or should this be meleagris? If so, then okay to use the Hawaiian name ‘o’opu hue

Page: 3

[JKTK9]‘o’opu hue was entered here, but I removed it because ‘o’opu hue is only for Arothron meleagris and Chilomycterus affinis—all poisonous swellfishes, puffers, balloon fishes, and globefishes.

Page: 3

[JKTK10]Or should this be Lycondontis undulatus? If so, then okay to use puhi laumilo, which was removed from third column because puhi laumilo is only Lycondontis undulatus.

Page: 3

[JKTK11]Or should this be Acanthurus nigroris? If so, then okay to use Hawaiian name “maiko.” Note that it should NOT be mAikoiko (long A), which is a species of sugar cane.

Page: 3

[JKTK12]Or should this be Echidna nebulosa? If so, then puhi kApA (long A) is okay to use. If Gymnothorax flavimarginatus is the commoner long eel, then puhi paka (not kapa) is okay to use.

Page: 3

[JKTK13]If this is Awaous genivatus (indigenous), then Hawaiian name o’opu naniha is okay to re-enter into third column.
