- regulatory compliance
- affordability
- community acceptance

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the criteria

In addition to cost, there are 8 criteria identified by the community as important for developing the solutions. They are:

- water quality improvements;
- reduction of sewer basement back-ups and odors;
- reduction of street flooding;
- minimizing community disruptions;
- simplicity (reliability) of solutions;
- opportunities for coordinated infrastructure improvements;
- compatibility with the community; and
- opportunities for community enhancements.

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
